Five of the best places to 'Pop The Question'

With Valentines Day approaching, Charlotte Gay reveals some special places to pop the question

1) St Michaels Mount

[St Michaels Mount](#) resides off the coast of Marazion, Cornwall, and is frequently remarked as a truly unique little island. Known for its cobbled causeway to the island, it becomes only accessible during low tide, and so a trip via the ancient harbour to hop aboard a local vessel is needed to explore the area. A castle is set upon the isle and is still inhabited. The St Aubyns came to St Michaels Mount in 1647 and in 1954 Francis St Aubyn gave the site to the National Trust under a 999-year lease for the family to live in the castle.

At sunset, looking out over the dolphin waters, this idyllic location provides a truly romantic getaway.

EAT

At the heart of ancient market town Marazion still stands [The Kings Arms](#), ever since it first opened in the early 18th century. The large selection of traditional Cornish Ales, lagers, wines and spirits, coffees and teas provides a light refreshment. The pub also prides itself on its varied home cooked food specialising in fresh Newlyn fish dishes from the harbour.

STAY

Overlooking St Michael's Mount itself and the bay, [The Mount Haven](#) is a contemporary destination looking to bring you a peaceful and relaxing experience away from busy urban life. Specialising in one night spring getaways the hotel offers such packages as 'escape for a night'. For £210 the night includes a 'superior room with balcony, dinner bed and breakfast and half a bottle of champagne'.
